Consortium for Research on Innovation Studies (CRIS)

Consortium for Research on Innovation Studies is a growing network of innovation scholars, working towards creating learning and competence-building opportunities for early career scholars especially from the Global South.

The CRIS network was founded during 2021, by a few early career innovation scholars, who met and befriended at various GlobeLics events and bound by its inclusive and egalitarian spirit. During the covid induced lockdown we got together to organise a lecture series on theoretical foundations of innovation systems mainly for the benefit of students and early career researchers from developing countries. The lecture series was named Christopher Freeman Centenary lecture Series as it coincided with the birth centenary year (2021-22) of Chris Freeman. We continue the activity beyond the centenary year, in response to the huge demand and encouraging testimonials from our regular audience from all parts of the world, and produced nearly 150 hours of virtual programs. The project runs on zero-funding and pro-bono time commitment from a catalytic-lifelong-community of fellows. Open access to the recordings offers a unique opportunity for learning, knowledge-brokering, academic-networking and mentoring to ECRS.

The unequal distribution of innovation and research capabilities in the global south, coupled with the disproportionate allocation of benefits from scientific research ecosystems, presents significant challenges. Often, research conducted by global north entities in the global south lacks sufficient engagement with local researchers and ecosystems, leading to power asymmetries and funding disparities. The commercialization and publication of research findings often favour the global north, further exacerbating inequalities. Addressing these issues requires a concerted effort to build research capabilities in the global south and ensure equitable participation and benefit-sharing in scientific research. The following activities were undertaken, to address unequal distribution of innovation research-capability and the disproportionate benefits-allocation of global scientific research ecosystems.

In this endeavour, we have collaborated with Association for South-South Cooperation in Innovation Systems Transformation (ASSIST Ltd., UK) and the Universiti Malaya North-South Research Centre (UMNSRC).



The role and contribution of science to attaining the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) will be the central theme of the Summit. The objective was to develop and launch science collaborations to demonstrate global science mechanisms and activities to support the attainment of the UN SDGs, Agenda 2030 and Local2030. Rethinking Innovation for Sustainability: Lessons from Australian and Californian Agrifood Systems.


